AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY:

During the Special Meeting of the West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission (CAC) on March 10, 2022, an Agenda Item was approved to proceed with organizing and managing two separate community engagement and enrichment project concepts: Community Wreaths and a Community Alebrije Sculpture. Both projects correlate with the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* at Cantigny Park art installation that opens June 1, 2022. Preliminary planning for each project has yet to be executed.

In addition to the CAC's projects, the City and various community partners have been working on the development of an overall community collaboration project to celebrate the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* installation in West Chicago. As part of this collaboration, the group has created the *West Chicago Alebrijes Project: Project Plan*. The Project Plan outlines a complete community collaboration project, and also provides an outline for each community partner's contributing project and timeline.

In order to proceed with the development of the *West Chicago Alebrijes Project: Project Plan*, and to also include the CAC's projects, City staff provided a preliminary Project Plan for both CAC projects that provides a summary and preliminary timeline for each as they correlate with the Project Plan's Concept Summary.

Recommendation

As presented in the *West Chicago Alebrijes Project: Project Plan*, staff has provided a recommended Project Plan for the CAC projects that provide project summaries and proposed timelines that correlate with the larger community collaboration.

Staff recommends that the CAC approve the Community Alebrijes Wreaths Workshops and West Chicago Community Alebrije Sculpture Project Plans provided in the *West Chicago Alebrijes Project: Project Plan*. In addition, staff recommends the CAC host an additional Special Meeting in April to accomplish the following: confirm availability of Commission members and assign event dates; confirm promotional needs; confirm project needs; and begin the preliminary process of creating each project.

AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY:

The CAC has approximately \$5,000 to utilize for various projects throughout the year. Annually, this budget allocates funds for the City's Annual Art Banner Exhibit Project, and also the Gallery 200 Artist-In-Residence Program apart from any additional projects the CAC pursues.

Annual Art Banner Exhibit Estimated Cost & 'Artist-In-Residence' Program Cost

The previous cost for the Annual Art Banner Exhibit Project through the City's 2022 printing vendor was \$1,759 for 23 banners (\$76.50/each). The 2022 Art Banner Exhibit Project has potentially 42 banners that could be included as part of the exhibit, which would cost approximately \$3,213 if all artwork was to be used.

In previous years, the CAC allocated \$500 for the Artist-In-Residence Program.

Anticipated Budget Concerns

With the cost of the annual Artist-In-Residence Program and the estimated cost of banners this year, the CAC would have approximately \$1,287 to utilize over the course of the year for other projects.

In preliminary staff cost estimates for the Community Wreath project a material cost of approximately \$1,500 was anticipated that would include \$800 for pre-made 18" grapevine wreaths, and \$700 for additional art supplies that could be used to create wreaths by CAC members and also be distributed to community members. An additional \$500 was allocated for materials for the Community Alebrije Sculpture. The total initial cost estimate of materials for both projects was approximately \$2,000.

The CAC would be approximately \$713 over the \$5,000 budgeted amount for the year between: the estimated \$3,213 for the Annual Art Banner Exhibit Project; \$500 for the Artist-In-Residence Program; the estimated \$2,000 for the Alebrijes Community Art Project; and no funding for a Fall/Winter Project.

Recommendation

In reviewing the options, staff has developed the following (3) budgetary scenarios with budget limits for each project/program for the CAC to consider as the 'Cultural Arts Commission – 2022 Projects Budget' through December 2022.

Option 1

- Art Banner Exhibit Project: \$2,300 (30 banners)
- Artist-In-Residence Program: \$500
- Alebrijes Community Art Project: \$1,700
 - (270) 18" wreaths: \$900
 - Wreath materials: \$500
 - Sculpture materials: \$300
- Fall/Winter Project: \$500

Option 2

- Art Banner Exhibit Project: \$2,750 (36 banners)
- Artist-In-Residence Program: \$500
- Alebrijes Community Art Project: \$1,250
 - (225) 18" wreaths: \$750
 - Wreath materials: \$250
 - Sculpture materials: \$250
- Fall/Winter Project: \$500

Option 3

- Art Banner Exhibit Project: \$3,250 (42 banners)
- Artist-In-Residence Program: \$500
- Alebrijes Community Art Project: \$1,250
 - (225) 18" wreaths: \$750
 - Wreath materials: \$250
 - Sculpture materials: \$250
- Fall/Winter Project: \$0

Staff recommends the CAC consider Option 3 for the 'Cultural Arts Commission – 2022 Projects Budget'.

Ultimately, the Art Banner Exhibit banners and the Alebrijes Community Engagement Project provide firm results through the presence of seasonal activities/features for the community to enjoy. Funding for those particular projects should be maximized to their full potential as the projects are defined and ready to proceed into implementation.

In addition, should cost-savings arise through the Art Banner Exhibit Project and/or the Alebrijes Community Engagement Project then the unutilized funding for those projects could be allocated towards a Fall/Winter Project.

Project Background

The West Chicago Alebrijes Project

The West Chicago Alebrijes Project is a community project initiative created through the collaboration of multiple West Chicago community partner organizations dedicated to providing a unique community art experience in the City of West Chicago inspired by the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* art installation at Cantigny Park.

The West Chicago Alebrijes Project consists of several community partners that include the City of West Chicago, the Mexican Cultural Center DuPage, Gallery 200, the West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission, the West Chicago Public Library District, the West Chicago Park District, the DuPage Symphony Orchestra, and the DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau.

Through the promotion of an overall concept revolving around the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* art installation at Cantigny Park, participating community partners aim to assist each other in promoting each partner's regular annual events and features while also promoting West Chicago as a whole.

What are alebrijes?

Alebrijes are imaginary mythical creatures inspired by Mexican folklore made popular by the famous Mexican artist, Pedro Linares, and most recently the Disney movie, *Coco*. Each year, Mexico celebrates the alebrijes as spirit guides by creating giant paper-mache sculptures and displaying them leading up to the Day of the Dead. This year, they will be included as part of Mexico City's Day of the Dead parade.

Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World

Cantigny Park, in collaboration with the Mexican Cultural Center DuPage and the DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau (DCVB), will be installing over 45 alebrijes sculptures created by Mexican artists, with some being as large as 18-feet tall. The sculptures will be located throughout the park and on display from June through October. A special map showing the locations of the different alebrijes will be available, so visitors can seek out the different sculptures, while also exploring the park and all of its amenities as a whole.

City of West Chicago's Sponsorship of Event

The City of West Chicago has invested \$10,000 with the DCVB to be an official sponsor of the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World*. As a sponsor, the City will be included in marketing and communications materials leading up to and during the event. The City is also the home of the Mexican Cultural Center DuPage and has a large demographic of community members who are of Mexican descent.

Project Objectives

There are two primary objectives of *The West Chicago Alebrijes Project*: destination marketing and community enrichment.

The West Chicago Alebrijes Project: Project Plan aims to complete both objectives by outlining a project plan that guides a project unique to West Chicago that coincides with the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* art installation at Cantigny Park. The Project Plan will achieve this by assisting with the following:

1. Establishing a series of experiences in the City of West Chicago that create a regional point of interest.

2. Establishing a unique community enrichment project, and/or series of experiences, that engages all West Chicago community members.

Project Goals

Destination Marketing

- Establish West Chicago as an additional destination to visit and explore in conjunction with the Cantigny Park installation.
- Provide a unique experience that highlights the City as an 'Arts City', while promoting the City as an exciting place to live, visit, and/or do business.
- Create a temporary large-scale 'destination experience' installation in West Chicago, and assess the viability of creating future similar installations.

Community Enrichment

- Provide an enjoyable and memorable experience for West Chicago residents.
- Highlight the Mexican culture as it relates to the alebrijes while also integrating the City's Western European culture into a community engagement project, and/or event(s).
- Solicit and acquire participation from local businesses and organizations in community engagement activities.

Project Understanding

Branding

The West Chicago Alebrijes Project is a community project initiative and collaboration of community partners with a set goal of promoting their unique events and features. As part of *The West Chicago Alebrijes Project*, each community partner has created an individual event and/or activities that coincide with their regular events,

the series of those events is branded as the *Days of the Alebrijes*.

Concept Summary

Each of the *Days of the Alebrijes* experiences revolve around the conceptual idea of a 'portal' that is based within the City of West Chicago.

The portal symbolizes the dreams in which Pedro Linares imagined the initial mythical creatures and then brought them to reality through his sculptures. Much like his dreams, the overall proposed concept is to bring forth alebrijes from imagination to reality through a "series of magical events and imaginative creatures in West Chicago."

The *Days of the Alebrijes* will begin with the alebrijes escaping their world and taking up residence in West Chicago. Each community partner has created events and activities that coincide with this storyline while also highlighting their own specific community events.

Community Partner Roles

While each partner will advocate on behalf of and promote West Chicago throughout *The West Chicago Alebrijes Project* period, each will also have the following primary roles:

City of West Chicago

1. Plan and organize a large-scale art installation in downtown area.
2. Create a webpage on City site to centralize all information.
3. Create a Project Plan that outlines overall project.
4. Create a Strategic Plan that guides project components.

West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission

1. Plan and organize a community activity.
2. Coordinate with Gallery 200, Mexican Cultural Center DuPage, and West Chicago Park District to organize an art exhibit.

Mexican Cultural Center DuPage

1. Plan and organize an art exhibit with Gallery 200.
2. Plan and organize a community activity with DuPage Symphony Orchestra.
3. Plan and organize a community mural.
4. Coordinate with Gallery 200, West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission, and West Chicago Park District to organize an art exhibit.

Gallery 200

1. Coordinate with Mexican Cultural Center DuPage to organize an artist exhibit.
2. Plan and organize an art exhibit with Cultural Arts Commission, Mexican Cultural Center DuPage, and West Chicago Park District.

DuPage Symphony Orchestra

1. Coordinate with Mexican Cultural Arts Center DuPage to organize a community activity.

West Chicago Public Library District

1. Plan and organize a community event.

West Chicago Park District

1. Plan and organize a community activity.
2. Coordinate with Gallery 200, Mexican Cultural Center DuPage, and West Chicago Cultural Arts Commission to organize an art exhibit.

DuPage Convention and Visitors Bureau

1. Ensure the City is included and recognized as a sponsor of *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* at Cantigny Park.
2. Promote West Chicago's regular special event(s) as using the DCVB organization's state and regional partnerships.

Project Details

The following sections will describe each community experience listed within the Project Timeline in more detail.

Maquetas y Bocetos: Art Exhibit

Beginning Friday, April 8, an art exhibit featuring the initial models and drawings from artists of the Cantigny Park exhibit will be featured emerging from a portal at the City's Gallery 200. The exhibit will be promoted as the only location to see artwork representing the *Alebrijes: Creatures of a Dream World* art installation at Cantigny Park prior to their actual installation.

No reference to the *Days of the Alebrijes* events will be made through Friday, May 13 in order to not deter attention from the special art exhibit.

Beginning Saturday, June 4, the exhibit will include footprints emerging from the portal featured within the art exhibit and be promoted as the location in which alebrijes escaped their world to visit West Chicago and are now located throughout its downtown area.

The *Maquetas y Bocetos* exhibit, and Gallery 200, will remain the central location and kick-off to the *Days of the Alebrijes* in West Chicago.

Days of Alebrijes: Downtown Installation

Beginning Saturday, June 4, the West Chicago downtown area will be transformed through the installation of 'life-sized' alebrijes creatures featured on different buildings along with *Days of the Alebrijes* branded signage. The alebrijes are to have escaped from the Gallery 200 exhibit's portal and are now hiding throughout downtown West Chicago.

A map showing the alebrijes locations will be created and available at different locations in the downtown area as well as online. The alebrijes graphics will also incorporate QR codes that links to a *Days of the Alebrijes* landing page on the City's website that has information about different cultural and historical information and other events and/or experiences.

The installation will be in the downtown area through the conclusion of the *Days of the Alebrijes* on Saturday, October 22 when the alebrijes return to their own world.

Community Alebrijes Wreaths Workshops

Beginning Saturday, May 21, at the City's Blooming Fest, the Cultural Arts Commission will begin leading a community activity to instruct and provide materials to create wreaths that are inspired by alebrijes or the Mexican culture. The wreaths are to symbolize the portal in which the alebrijes have escaped.

The Commission will attend community events throughout

the *Days of the Alebrijes* and host workshops that showcase pre-created wreaths by Commission members and will also provide instruction on how people can create their own using provided materials.

A selection of created community wreaths will be placed on display at Gallery 200 beginning Friday, September 9 to help lure the alebrijes back through the portal to return to their own world which will occur on the conclusion of *Days of the Alebrijes* on Saturday, October 22.

West Chicago Community Alebrije Sculpture

Beginning Monday, June 13, the Cultural Arts Commission will begin soliciting feedback from West Chicago residents on items to incorporate into a large West Chicago alebrije creature sculpture the Commission will create that will be used to lure the alebrijes back to the portal at the end of *Days of the Alebrijes*.

Weather depending, and if logistically possible, the Commission will bring the sculpture to the Community Alebrijes Wreath Workshops to have community members assist with the building of the sculpture.

The West Chicago Alebrije sculpture

will be housed at Gallery 200 as it is being built, and will be placed on display at Gallery 200 beginning Friday, September 9 to help lure the alebrijes back to the portal to return to their own world which will occur on the conclusion of *Days of the Alebrijes* on Saturday, October 22.

West Chicago Alebrije Dream Paintings: Live Artist Painting Project

On Saturday, July 16, during the Taco and Art Festival, West Chicago artists will be on site to paint a series of large chalk paintings on black boards. The painting themes would be conceptually inspired by alebrijes who have escaped the portal and visited the West Chicago artists' dreams recently.

In addition to the Community Wreaths and the Community Alebrije Sculpture, the artist painting will be placed at Gallery 200 as part of a larger exhibit featuring community inspired alebrije projects.

The West Chicago Alebrije Portal: Art Exhibit

Beginning Friday, September 9, an art exhibit featuring Fernando Ramirez's Alebrije Portal from the Mexican Cultural Center DuPage's *Maquetas y Bocetos* exhibit, along with a selection of the Community Alebrijes Wreaths, the West Chicago Alebrije Sculpture, and the paintings from the West Chicago Alebrije Dream Paintings will be featured at Gallery 200. The exhibit is meant to be a culmination of the artwork created through the *Days of the Alebrijes* in West Chicago, and was created to help lure the alebrijes back home through the portal which still stands.
